Annual Security Report

October 1, 2019

The staff members of Vocational Education and Extension Board (VEEB) are dedicated to maintaining a safe environment. All staff and students of VEEB School of Practical Nursing are encouraged to report any emergencies and/or suspicious activities immediately to the Nursing Supervisor/and Safety Officer will initiate the appropriate action. In the event of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the school - 911 and/or Hicksville fire department will be notified without delay to the situation by initiating the appropriate communications to the affected students, faculty and staff unless the communication compromises the efforts to assist victims or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency. The appropriate authorities will be notified in a timely fashion and action will be taken to protect the wellbeing of the school community.

Fire Emergency and Evacuation:

In the event of fire in the school, the alarm system will be activated. The building will be evacuated in accordance with emergency evacuation plans. Fire drills are conducted throughout the year by Frank Hockenbroct the School Safety Officer. Faculty, staff and students are required to move at least 50 feet from the building. This allows emergency responders access to the building.

Lockdown Plan:

In certain critical situations, it may be determined that a safe place for the staff or students is inside the building. Under such circumstances the building will be secured by use of the Lockdown Plan. Upon initiation, the Nursing Supervisor will begin the appropriate communications to affected school members. The Lockdown Plan will continue until it is reasonably believed that the immediate danger has been addressed. Once determined the school is safe, the school can resume normal routine.

Reporting an Incident:

Incidents should be reported to the Nursing Supervisor or designated individual who will contact the local police department depending upon the severity of the incident.

Drug, Alcohol and Smoking Policy:

VEEB follows a "Drug Free" protocol, "Smoke Free" and "Alcohol Free" environment, whether at the school or clinical sites. It is unlawful to sell, furnish or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. The possession of alcohol by anyone under 21 years of age in a public place or place open to the public is illegal. Possession and use of any alcoholic beverage or illegal drug is prohibited in school. Violators may be subject to local, state, and federal law as well as school policy. The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019 The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA)

The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019 The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), enacted in 1994, is landmark legislation responding to our nation's crisis of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) creates and supports comprehensive, cost-effective responses to the pervasive and insidious crimes of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking. VEEB Practical Nursing prohibits the crimes of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking as defined for purposes of the Clery Act. All VAWA crimes shall be investigated and addressed pursuant to VEEB Policy and NYS laws.

The School shall, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence (as that term is defined in section 16 of title 18, United States Code), or a nonforcible sex offense, the report on the results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by such institution against a student who is the alleged perpetrator of such crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of such crime or offense, the next of kin of such victim shall be treated as the alleged victim for purposes of this paragraph.

For purposes of the Clery Act, “dating violence,” “domestic violence,” and “stalking” are defined in the Department’s regulations as follows:

Dating Violence The term “dating violence” means violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim and where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors: the length of the relationship; the type of relationship; and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship. Domestic violence (also called intimate partner violence (IPV), domestic abuse or relationship abuse) is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate relationship. Stalking is the act or crime of willfully and repeatedly following or harassing another person in circumstances that would cause a reasonable person to fear injury or death especially because of express or implied threats (Merriam- Webster Dictionary – Legal definition – (October -2019); <https://www.merriam-webster.com/legal/stalking>

Sexual Assault is illegal sexual contact that usually involves force upon a person without consent or is inflicted upon a person who is incapable of giving consent (as because of age or physical or mental incapacity) or who places the assailant (such as a doctor) in a position of trust or authority (Merriam – Webster Dictionary – Medical Definition of Sexual Assault – (October 2019); <https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/sexual%20assault>
